Bulletin Cover - Pauli #1 by Rev. Kendal Brown - Pauli #1 is a mixed-media collage on canvas board that honors the life and legacy of Pauli Murray—attorney, activist, priest, and visionary for justice. Using archival photographs, fragments of text, and aged paper ephemera, the work layers visual traces of Murray's journey across law, faith, and social transformation. Images referencing the courts, activism, and the Episcopal tradition evoke Murray's groundbreaking role as a legal thinker, civil rights advocate, and the first Black woman ordained in the Episcopal Church. Through textured composition and historical materials, the collage reflects the complexity of Murray's life and the enduring impact of her pursuit of justice, equality, and spiritual calling.
